IPCC: Climate change probably makes species extinctions more likely

The 4th IPCC synthesis report, published 17 November, highlights the increased risk of species extinctions from global warming: "There is medium confidence that approximately 20-30% of species assessed so far are likely to be at increased risk of extinction if increases in global average warming exceed 1.5-2.5oC (relative to 1980-1999).
