BioNET participated in the fifth Norway-UN <u>Trondheim Conference on Biodiversity</u>, 29 October–2 November 2007. Participants discussed why biodiversity is an important component of sustainable development and poverty alleviation. From 3 - 5 October, BioNET participated in a meeting on DNA barcoding in Europe organized by the European Distributed Institute of Taxonomy (EDIT) at the Museum Naturalis in Leiden, the Netherlands. The general goals of the conference were a) to coordinate DNA barcoding activities in Europe and initiate working groups, and b) to explore funding options, particularly in view of the 7th framework programme of the EU.

The goal of the Working Group is to elaborate and negotiate an international regime on access and benefit-sharing. One of the issues examined at the meeting was the access to biocontrol agents to combat invasive species.
