Considering:

That due to the abnormal of the situation, the communications by mail with the Departments of Bluefields, Esteli, Nueva Segovia and Jinotega, are obstructed on account of the effects of the Decree of the Executive dated 28 of last April, dealing with the exchange of the postal, telegraphic and fiscal seals for the resealed for 1927.

121 In use of his facultities,

Decrees:

ONLY- To prolong for a month the date of force of the said decree with the purpose of leaving without legal value the postal, telegraphic and fiscal seal which do not bear the inscription "Reseal 1927"

Until the next 15th of June it can be used in the Departments of Bluefields, Esteli, Nueva Segovia, Jinotega, Chontales y Rivas, the mentioned species which do not bear the reseal of 1927. After this date they will not have oficial value.

Given in Managua-Palace of the Executive, on the 12 of May of 1927- Adolfo Diaz- The Minister of Finance- F. Guzman.

Considering:

144 1st- That there is in existence at the Warehouse of Fiscal Species certain amount of Postal Stamps, Telegraphic Seals and Fiscal Seals of old issuance, either resealed or without seal;

147 2nd- That there are besides, a great existence of the mentioned species, of recent issuance, that were brought in with the only purpose of exchanging the old issues;

3rd- That the fact of having acumulated in the warehouse a great existence of species of the same kind and values, but of different colors ones, and resealed the others, denounces lack of seriousness and uniformity in the handling of the sames, impairs the inventory taking and balances in the General Warehouse and it is liable to fraudulence practices,

Decrees:

1st- From this date on are totally valueless and out of circulation all the postal species of old issuance or resealed, including those of air mail; the fiscal seals of old issuance or resealed;

2nd- The following kinds of species of the difference values and colors of the new issuance, will substitute all those ~~and~~ canceled by this decree;

3.- The Incometax Offices of the Republic will send back immediately to the General Warehouse of Fiscal Species all the species cancelled in virtue of this decree that happen to be in their possession and these said offices are hereby unauthorized to exchange new species for those that are being put out of circulation.

§

4.- The Exchequer Office and the General Treasury are authorized through a formal investigation to order to incinerate, according to the law procedure, all the cancelled species that are in bad shape and that can not be realized with philatelic purposes; likewise to put on sale, exclusively with such philatelic purposes; those species that are in good conditions, according to orders and prices set by the Minister of Finances in each case.
