- 750,000 Air series, short, for children (Junior set) of 5 different stamps at \$0.15 (US \$0.03) each set.
- 60,000 Complete series, common current (13 different stamps) at \$5.00 (US \$1.00) each serie.
- 40,000 Complete series, common current in blocks of four stamps

 (10,000 blocks of four) at \$20.00 (US \$4.00) each serie of thirteen (13) blocks.

<u>DECREE</u> - For the information of our readers, we are reproducing in its entirety Executive Decree authorizing the circulation of the new issue of postage stamps to honor the United Central American Organization (ODECA).

*No. 8 - The PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC, taking in consideration that the new postage stamps both for air and ordinary mail, have arrived, and been entered at the General Offices of Especies Fiscales, and charged to their account; and that after due examination, said stamps have been found in good order, and said stamps having been printed by THOMAS DE LA RUE & CO. of London, England, under the name of ODECA STAMPS, in accordance with the first part of the printing agreement Bo. 36, dated October 24, 1952, duly approved by Executive resolution of same date, and partly modified by Contract and Agreement No. 53, dated February 20, 1953, he DECREES:

SINGLE: From April 15, 1953, there will go into official circulation till totally exhausted, the following steel engraved stamps, printed as per stipulations mentioned above, and issued according to vote VI of meeting at the Ministers of Foreigh Relations of Central America, which meeting was held in San Salvador, in the month of October 1951 this issue of stamps to popularize the desire of a Central American Union as stated in the Charter of organization of the Central American States.

The President of the Republic

considering

That by Decree #338 of the 29th of January 1945 the Legislature set aside the second week of November each year as "Communications Week" during which week double rates will be charged on all mail. Telegraph and Telephone matter. This extra revenue to be for the benefit of the deserving and loyal employees of the Communications Dept. of the Government.

Considering

That Art.2 of said law expressly requires that double Postal, Telegraphic and Telephonic rates be charged and collected.

Considering

That at present there is not available stamps for such purpose and having to provide such an issue

Decrees

Art. 1 - That 1,000,000 copies of the S. C. Aquamarine blue stamps of Will Rogers Air Mail issue of 1939, illustrated with a view of the old "Cottage of the PAA" be transferred to the National Printing and Binding Dept. and there surcharged with the inscription" Telegraphic Seal, - week of Communications --Value C\$-- and in the following quantities:

- Aft. 2 These stamps will then be returned to the General Warehouse of Fiscal Stamps to be charged to the Postal Dept. according to the new nomenclature and value, then to be placed in circulation in accordance with the law.
- Art. 3 The printing of these stamps will be supervised by representatives of Exchequer, Income Office, General Office of Communications and Control Office of Fiscal and Philatelic Stamps who will see that the work of printing is done neatly and without mistakes.

In the event any sheets of stamps are damaged during the process of printing, a corresponding number of sheets will be drawn from the warehouse to replace these damaged sheets so that the finished quantities of the new stamps will be in accordance with Art. 1 of this Decree.

Art. 4 - Complete records shall be made of all circumstances and details of the surcharging operation to be done.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC

Considering,

That it is approching the "Communications Week", or it is to say the second week of the month of November of each year, during which it will be aplied double rate to the postal movement, telegraphic and telephonic of the Republic according with a disposal of Legislative Decree # 338 of 29th of January of 1945, charge that according to the above mentioned law has the object to benefit the abnegated and loyal servants of the State in the Branch of Communication:

Considering:

That the Art. 2nd of the referred law expressly states that the double of the postal, telegraphic and telephonic rates must be collected with postal stamps or telegraphic seals of legal course;

Considering,

That at the present there is not available specie for such purpose and having to dictate the measures conducive to its creation:

Decrees:

Art. 1st. Of the existences of the General Warehouse of Fiscal Species is to be taken and transfemed to the National Printing and Binding House the quantity of a million of interior Airmail postal stamps of the denomination of three cents aquamarine blue color, ilustrated with a view of the old "Cottage of the PAA" corresponding to the Postal Issuance of 1939 in homage of Will Rogers to be resealed with the inscription "Telegraphic Seal-Week of Communication-Value C\$ " (here the figure corresponding to the value) according with the following detail:

Art. 2nd.- The specie already resealed will go back to the General Warehouse of Fiscal Species to be charge to the accounts according to its new nomenclature and value, then been ready for its sale with conformity of the law pro "Communications Weeks nand its rules."

Art. 3rd.— The printing of the resealing will be supervised by representatives of the Exchequer, Income Office, General Office of Communications and Control Office of Fiscal and Philatelic Species who in the performance of their mission will take care that the printing is made neat and without mistakes.

(*) The species that happen to be marred by deffects of the printing will be incinerated taking from the General Warehouse of Fiscal Species the sheets of the kind of stamp concerned in the necesary amount in order that when the printing is over turn out the quantities to be resealed according to the command in the Art. 1st. of the present Decree.

Art. 4th.- An act will be written leaving record of all the circunstances and details of the resealing operation to be done.

(*) Note. I am taking the liberty to rewrite this special paragraph placing the puntuation I consider will make it more understandable. I am sure the original document has it.
